





Special in our own little way?


What does that mean? I'm on my way to find out. Would you like to join my search?


Cemara's Family 1 [Keluarga Cemara 1] By ARSWENDO ATMOWILOTO

She lives with Abah, the breadwinner of the family, who works as a pedicab driver and a handyman whenever needed. To support them, Emak, the mother, makes sweet grain snacks and asks her daughters to sell them around the village. Euis, the firstborn daughter, is in the 6th grade and has experienced the family's wealthy condition in the past before they fell into poverty. The youngest daughter Agil is a sweet girl who puts a smile in everyone's face. *Cemara's Family* is an evocative novel about the importance of family in the lives of young people trying to make it in this crazy world. Its sweet stories show us that tears can actually be a sign of happiness and that there is always hope even in the time of hardship.

Arswendo Atmowiloto was born in Solo, on November 26, 1948. At the beginning of his writing career, he wrote in Javanese. He had produced numerous literary works; some made him the recipient of many writing awards. His experience in prison served as an inspiration to several of his novels including *Projo and Brojo*, several Christian books, numerous articles, and a collection of touching anecdotes called *Counting the Days*. 

A Cat on the Moon and Other Stories [Insomnia] By ANTON KURNIA

A Cat on the Moon and Other Stories contains dark yet beautiful stories about love, loneliness and solitude. In these stories, Anton Kurnia also tells about human tragedy in various places—from Aceh in Indonesia to Buenos Aires in Argentina: missing persons, forgotten massacres, political killings, rape and violence, and religious conflicts. Kurnia's narrators are grappling with their own private quests while living on the edges, in constant flight from nightmarish threats. But the world Kurnia has created is, like Kafka's, perfectly logical in its strangeness. His stories are often witty, frequently melancholy, and sneakily touching. His unique voice will give us a different view and experience of Indonesia, its people and its rich, and amazing culture.

Anton Kurnia is an author, translator, editor, and publisher. His books include a collection of short stories Insomnia (Jalasutra, 2004) which is translated into English as A Cat on the Moon and Other Stories; a collection of essays Mencari Setangkai Daun Surga: Jejak Perlawanan Manusia Atas Hegemoni Kuasa (Diva P ress, 2016); and Ensiklopedia Sastra Dunia (Diva Press, 2019).
